

2015 Joseph Barnes Lifetime Achievement Award AGG Celebrates the Work of Charles Z. Lawrence

The AGG Board of Directors is pleased to announce that the 2015 Joseph Barnes Lifetime Achievement Award will be presented to Charles Ziegler (CZ) Lawrence at the 2015 Conference in Washington, DC.

Lawrence is one of the last living Pennsylvania craftsmen to be commissioned to work in the prestigious National Cathedral

in Washington, DC, for whom he has designed five windows. He will be speaking to us about his work there. His stained

Those of us present at the 2011 Conference in Asheville, NC remember his uniquely entertaining Keynote Presentation. Congratulations, CZ!

Charles Ziegler (CZ) Lawrence has devoted his life to the craft of stained glass window-making. Beginning in 1956, CZ embarked on a rigorous, formal apprenticeship to the German master craftsman Rudolph H. Buenz. He is one of the few remaining American stained glass artisans trained in the traditional method.

CZ Lawrence's many commissions over the last four decades

have established him as a true master of American stained glass. Reknowned for both abstract and representational work, Law-





glass windows can be seen churches. synagogues, corporate offices, schools and public spaces across the country. In addition to his impressive accomplishments in stained glass, Lawrence is also a painter, skilled in the use of watercolor and oil paints.

In the 1960s. Lawrence studied art and design at the Pratt School of Design in Brooklyn, NY. While there, he became heavily influenced by the painters of the French Impressionist Period and The

New York School. During that time period he also worked at Rambusch, where he observed and was influenced by Robert Pinart and Robert Sowers' stained glass design method and was taught design studio procedures by William Haley. Lawrence then went on to work in many of the east coast, stained glass studios, becoming the premiere designer at the Willet Studios in Philadelphia, before starting his own company in the 1980s.

Charlie's unique style, both personally and artistically, is known and loved by many in the stained glass community.

lington Bridge Commission, Burlington County, NJ; Gore (Gore-Tex) Manufacturing Co., Cherry Hill, MD; University of Rochester, Rochester, NY; Penn State University, St. Cyril's Catholic Church, Houston, TX; International Baptist Seminary, The Prague, Czech Republic; The Lutheran Theological Seminary, Philadelphia, PA and hundreds of other works.

Charles Z. Lawrence has devoted much of his adult life, over 45 years, to the craft of stained glass window making. Beginning in his early twenties, Lawrence embarked on a rigorous, formal apprenticeship to the German master craftsman Rudolf H. Buenz. He is one of the few remaining American stained glass artisans to have been trained in the traditional method of apprenticeship.

His signature style blends traditional methods of stained glass window construction with a contemporary design philosophy and modern innovations in materials and production techniques. Essential to all Lawrence windows, is his unique use of bold, clear color, based on the artist's lifetime study of color. I've developed my color pallet over the years, by observing and painting the changing fall leaves. "Their colors are so vibrant, they have a rich jewel like quality that I try to capture in all of my stained glass windows." That influence can be seen clearly in Lawrence's extensive body of work.





Sunday Bus Tour Highlight June 21, 2105 Kol Shalom Synagogue, Rockville MD

Ellen Mandelbaum was invited to design stained glass for a very unusual project: the Ark at Kol Shalom synagogue. Usually a narrow vertical cabinet, this ark would be horizontal – eighteen feet wide by five feet high. It would fill the full front width of the room. In the vision of Architect Salo Levinas, the Ark would be the only art in the sanctuary. This was an honor and also a great responsibility. She needed to solve technical problems but at the same time – whatever the technical difficulties, as an artist she still needed to "pour her love into the making." Mostly this was with the painting.

At the heart of the Ark, where the two doors meet, she says she did her best painting. Using traditional glass paints, which are metal oxides mixed with a vehicle (such as gum arabic or vinegar) and fired for permanence at 1200 degrees, she found several different kinds of paints to produce a variety of soft earth colors and gentle blues. Much of stained glass's terminology is culled from medieval stained glass techniques. She painted with trace line or overall matt tones playing against beautiful hand made mouth-blown soft translucent white *German Opal* glass. For this project, clear glass was flashed with a thin white layer to make it translucent instead of transparent, helping

to hide the Torahs as prescribed by tradition. In Jewish practice the Ark holds the Torahs and also hides them until, at special points in the service, the doors are opened to reveal them and closed again. White opal glass was used again as a base for the long band of gold stretching above the ark but here it is white opal reamy – a glass characterized by irregular ripples like flowing water. Mandelbaum painted

this glass first with silver stain - a glass paint made with actual silver that comes out transparent yellow when fired at 900 degrees. It is the only kind of paint that sinks into the glass's surface so that the glass retains its

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transparency. Silver stain is the source of the word stained glass. The long band at the top unifying all the parts of the ark was created as a symbol of god's compassion. As it says in the prayer books: "Blessed is the One whose compassion covers the earth and all its creatures."

This project was both unique and successful. Mandelbaum was delighted to be asked by the congregation to open and close the doors during the sabbath service the week after the synagogue was dedicated on April 27, 2012. Later, Deb Finkelstein, the administrative head of Kol Shalom, wrote,

"Ellen, clearly from the beginning of the process, possessed the ability to stay true to her art and also to listen to and incorporate the desires and comments of the committee members. The outcome is an inspiring and distinct design feature that is the focal point in our beautiful new sanctuary."



2nd Annual Chicago Stained Glass Invitational March 16-21, 2015

After the success of the 1st annual Chicago Stained Glass Invitational event, held in conjunction with the 43rd Glass Art Society conference, we decided to split the 2nd annual Chicago Stained Glass Invitational into a three-part week-long event, from Monday, March 16rd to Saturday, March 21st, 2015. The response was fabulous.

Working backwards, the official "Main Event" was the Invitational on the afternoon of Saturday March 21st. We had works submitted by ten stained glass artists (Cassy Krueger, Larry Zgoda, Emily Carlson, Ed Gilbertson, Natalia Klarer, T.R. Biddle, Rita Shimelfarb, Judson Portzer, Jamie Tadsen, Casey Van Loon and Vito Vol-Kovas) displayed in the front window, which served as a backdrop for activities. The first presentation was by Sarah King, who demonstrated her technique of "angel gilding" on glass, showing guests how

gold mirrored glass is created for the Prairie style windows that are so prevalent in this area. Rolf Achilles, Larry Zgoda and Emily Carlson started a lively round-table conversation about the "state of stained glass," bringing in some great questions from guests in the studio, as well as a suggestion that stained glass artists consider setting up booths as art shows like SOFA.

The final presentation was a video of a slide show that Emily gave at PechaKucha in December 2014, where she described the creative process to fill a 9' x 9' opening with an 11' x 11' x 24" sculptural stained glass installation.

Earlier that day, Solstice Stained Glass and Larry Zgoda Studio hosted a bus tour, visiting Second Presbyterian Church on Chicago's Michigan Avenue, the Elks Memorial at the north end of Lincoln Park, and finishing at a private residence where we had a rare opportunity to view Edgar Miller's work.

The final presentation was a video of a slide show that Emily gave at PechaKucha in December 2014, where she described the creative process to fill a 9'x 9' opening with an 11'x 11'x 24" sculptural stained glass installation.

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The three venues offered a great cross-section of styles of stained glass, starting with "what you would expect" - seven large and fabulous Tiffany windows in a church, then moving to European painted glass, and finishing with "something really different" at the Glassner House. This particular order allowed guests to end their excursion with the strong visual impression that stained glass can be accessible, fanciful and beautiful. Yes, stained glass is not just for sacred spaces!

The third aspect of the Invitational events was a fully booked, five-day long intensive Painting Workshop led by Indre McCraw. Indre handled the eleven students with aplomb. With painting skill levels ranging from beginner to highly advanced, each participant had the opportunity to explore the methods of stained glass painting while developing their own style. She explained history, materials, tools and techniques to the group as a whole while giving each student time and attention that helped them increase their knowledge base. Students in the Workshop included Bill Klopsch, Judson Portzer, Rita Shimelfarb, Migla Bronskiene, Jamie Tadsen, T.R. Biddle, Cassy Krueger, Lara Rosenbush, Larry Zgoda, Dale Noelte and Judy Kean.

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
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
